"Do you not know...?" (1 Cor 9:19-27)

- When Paul wrote those words, he assumed his audience understood the illustration. It was particularly appropriate in a letter to Corinth, which was the location of the biennial Isthmian Games-second in fame only to the Olympic Games.
- Everyone knew about these games and they provided Paul a perfect opportunity to draw the attention of Christians to a much greater reality.
