It takes faith to fish! How much more so when "fishing for people"?

## "Do Not Be Afraid; From Now On..."

- Peter already knew that Jesus was extraordinary (John 1:35-42; Luke 4:31-41).
- Then, on one occasion, everything changed (Luke 5:1-11).

## Three Things to Remember as We Develop the Faith to Fish

- ✓ Jesus is perfectly aware of our \_\_\_\_\_.
  - Having done his human best at the thing he was best at, Peter's nets were empty.
  - Why was this the perfect time for Jesus to call Peter to something greater?
    - Peter needed to have his weaknesses \_\_\_\_\_.
    - Peter needed to see himself as one who, apart from Jesus, could do \_\_\_\_\_ (John 15:5).
    - Peter needed to really \_\_\_\_\_ Jesus: the One who rules the fish and fills the nets.
- Jesus isn't asking us to do something we are \_\_\_\_\_\_ of doing.
  - Jesus didn't ask Peter to create fish, fill the Sea, or use a miraculous net.
  - Jesus isn't asking *us* to provide the sacrifice for sins or devise a plan for salvation.
  - In Luke 5:4, Jesus is simply asking Peter to \_\_\_\_\_\_ him and \_\_\_\_\_\_ his lead.
- ✓ At the right time, in the right way, for the right purpose, Jesus \_\_\_\_\_\_ the fish.
  - In Luke 5:8, it's clear that Peter realized \_\_\_\_\_ had filled the nets.
