Notice—especially in relation to our study this quarter—what we are told about this "new" life:

And I saw no ______ in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of ______ or _____ to shine on it, for the ______ of God gives it light, and its lamp is the Lamb. By its light will the nations walk, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it, and its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no ______ there. They will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will ever enter it, nor anyone who does what is detestable or false, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life. (21:22-27)

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of _____, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city; also, on either side of the river, the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, yielding its fruit each month. The leaves of the tree were for the ______ of the nations. No longer will there be anything accursed, but the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him. They will see his ______, and his name will be on their foreheads. And night will be no more.
