

Isaiah 54-56

In this unit we find the Messianic blessings upon God's people, those who believe and walk with Him.

Chapter 54

This chapter illustrates the glorious days ahead through the Messiah.

- 1. Great news for Zion (1-3)
 - the "barren one" (1) brings thought of Sarah and the child of promise
 - it is a time of expansion, growth and "spreading abroad"

2. Zion removed from shame (4-8)

- notice the words: shame, humiliated, disgraced
- fear not...you will not remember
- your husband is the Lord, with great compassion I will gather you
- Babylonian captivity is referred to as: for a brief moment I forsook you (7); for a moment I hid my face from you (8)
- 3. God has a covenant of peace (9-10)
 - a reminder that God keeps His promises
- 4. Zion will have protection (11-17)
 - the use of costly stones is a sign of great blessings and a picture of that Heavenly Jerusalem in Revelation (Rev 21:19)

Chapter 55 This chapter shows the great invitation of God

This is similar to the Lord's great invitation (Mt 11:28-30)

- 1. Free for all (1-3)
 - Rev 7:16; 22:17
 - the welcoming call to "come" (1)
- 2. Offered to all (3-5)
- 3. Seek and return while you can (6-13)
 - a plea to change (seek, call, forsake, return)

It is here that we find that God sees and thinks differently than we do (8-9)

Chapter 56 This chapter contrasts the blessings for the faithful and the warnings toward the unfaithful

- 1. The faithful are blessed (1-8)
 - this includes the outcasts such as foreigners and eunuchs
 - Blessed: is a form of a beatitude
- 2. God's house is a place of prayer (6-8)
 - this is offered to all people
- 3. The leaders are rebuked for not being faithful (9-12)
 - They are: blind watchmen

 Dogs that do not bark

 Shepherds without sense

 Lazy leaders

Dumb Dogs that Do Not Bark (10)

- 1. Some never bark
- 2. Some always bark
- 3. Some bark at the wrong time
