All miracles involved the impossible. They were things that no one else could do. It is hard, if not impossible to rank the miracles in order of importance. The feeding of 5,000 is

impressive, but it may not be as spectacular to us as stopping a storm on a rough sea.

But of all the miracles, raising the dead truly showed the enormous authority that Jesus had. Death is Satan's greatest tool and man's greatest fear. A person can deal with blindness, leprosy

Understanding The Teachings About Death:

- □ Death is the enemy of God (1 Cor 15:26)
- Jesus came to destroy the works of Satan (1 Jn 3:8)
- Satan has the power of death (Heb 2:14)
- □ Jesus delivered us from the fear of death (Heb 2:15)
- □ At death, there is a separation of the body and soul (Jas 2:26; Lk 16:22-23; Ecc 12:7)
- □ We live on after death (Lk 12:4)
- Our souls go to hades at death
 - this is where Jesus went at His death (Acts 2:31)

1. There are only three specific people that Jesus raised in the Gospels (widow's son, Synagogue official's daughter, Lazarus)

Jairus' daughter • was 12 years old and had just died

The widow's son, likely • had died that day

- Lazarus had been dead for four days and was already buried
- Jesus spoke to all three of the dead directly
- Only Lazarus' resurrection seemed planned •

- Paul raised Eutychus (Acts 20:9-12)
