

DANIEL SIX

Our study takes us to the most known chapter in Daniel and one of the most beloved stories in all the Bible: Daniel in the lion's den.

- This chapter is the last of the historical narratives in Daniel
- It is fairly straight forward, but the applications for us today are enormous

The Background

1. This takes place during the reign of the Medes (Darius is the king)

- VBS impressions of a teenage Daniel in the lion's den are not accurate
- The Babylonian captivity lasted 70 years. Daniel is easily in his 80's or even 90's by this time

Organizational Structure of Median Empire King (Darius) Commissioner Commissioner 120 Satraps

Daniel is one of these three commissioners

- Belshazzar appointed Daniel to # 3 spot in Babylon
- A. Because of the way Daniel applied himself and his spirit the king was ready to appoint Daniel to a new position of being over the entire kingdom (v. 3)
 - The other commissioners and satraps conspire to bring Daniel down
 - It seems that jealousy is fueling their contempt of Daniel
- 1. They could not find any corruption in Daniel (v. 4)
 - he is "blameless"
 - this is yet another reason why Ezekiel uses Daniel as an example of a righteous person (14:14, 20)
- 2. The opponents pressure Darius to sign a law that cannot be revoked (v. 5-9)
 - no prayers to any other god for 30 days
 - penalty for violating the law was death

Their statement is false "all the commissioners...have consulted together" (7)

3. Daniel knew (v. 10): the law and the consequences

- he prayed as he had "been doing previously"

Daniel prayed 3x a day, on his knees, facing Jerusalem

- Daniel was discovered and turned in

The prejudice against Daniel is illustrated with "Daniel, who is one of the exiles from Judah" (13) - that was over 50 years ago.

Similarities between ch 3 & ch 6

Death is the punishment Miraculous deliverance God is praised by the king

- Darius tries to save Daniel (14) but is pressured by the opponents (15) (similar to Esther 1:19; 8:8)
- Darius gives Daniel assurance that God will deliver him (16)
- The next morning it was discovered that Daniel was alive. God had sent His angel to protect him (23)
- The conspirators, and their families were all thrown into the lion's den (24)
- 4. Darius made a decree honoring God (26-27)
