1. The first beatitude has nothing to do with \_\_\_\_\_

2. This is a condition of the heart and how one views

- the Jews viewed wealth as a sign of divine favor

The word Jesus uses here (Ptochos) means to be

absolutely destitute. It's worse than the bare

minimum. It is to have nothing.

# Blessed is the Poor in Spirit

This is the first of the beatitudes. It all starts with this as the beginning point.

#### **Remember:**

These are not future blessings but present reality Christ followers are filled with joy

A contrast to the majority of the rabbis who gave a negative diet of gloom and doom

The blessedness runs counter to our culture This is not Chicken Soup for the Soul, but rather the way of life for a citizen of the kingdom

- Most of us have no idea what this is like physically. Some of us started out poor, but we always ate and had a place to sleep at night. We always had resources to get us through.
- The word here is one who has nothing, absolutely nothing.

. This is an attitude. It is to be bankrupt.

- It is Lazarus who was dumped at the rich man's gate (Lk 16:20-21)
  - It is the woman with the issue of blood who had spent all that she had (Mk 5:26)

## 3. The bankruptcy is "in spirit."

- This is what a man \_\_\_\_\_, not what he \_
- Here is a person who realizes that he is ruined spiritually. He's lost it all. He fell short (Rom 3:23)
- He's lost, Hell bound and he can't do anything about it
- This person sees sin as it really is. It's death. And, he is to blame for this condition.
- Spurgeon: "The way to rise in the kingdom is to sink in ourselves."

4. The other beatitudes do not matter if one does not realize that without God he has \_\_\_\_\_\_ Isa 64:6 We are unclean and our righteous deeds are like a filthy garment Lk 18:13 "God be merciful to me, the sinner"

# We must: See our sins as God

- Point our finger at
- Demonstrate our dependence upon God
- Lk 9:24 "For whoever wishes to save his life shall lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake, he is the one who will save it."
- James 4:10 "Humble yourselves in the presence of the Lord, and He will exalt you."
- Ps 51:17 The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and a contrite heart, O God, Thou wilt not despise.
- Ps 34:18 The Lord is near to the brokenhearted, and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

"Amazing Grace, that saved a wretch like me..."

- 5. This beatitude is about how we see ourselves. It is the opposite of pride, arrogance and independence.
  - This is a quality and characteristic that we carry all of our lives
  - The Laodicean church was not like this (Rev 3:17)
- 6. Such a person is "blessed" because such is the kingdom of Heaven
  - this is the same expression as the beatitude on persecution (v. 10)
- such a person will come humbly and thankfully to the Lord
- 7. The kingdom of Christ is not composed of the rich, proud and mighty, but the broken, the feeble, the spiritual needy. The kingdom is made up of those who will listen, follow and be obedient to Christ.

8. The rich Jesus became poor so we might be \_\_\_\_ (2 Cor 8:9)
