But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly, that now at last you have revived your concern for me; indeed, you were concerned *before*, but you lacked an opportunity *to act*. ¹¹ Not that I speak from need, for I have learned to be content in whatever *circumstances* I am. ¹² I know how to get along with little, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every *circumstance* I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need. ¹³ I can do all things through Him who strengthens me.

The Joy of Contentment in Christ



In this section of Philippians, Paul connects his financial needs to the wonderful help that the Philippi brethren gave to him.

- Multiple times the Philippians had helped Paul (1:5; 2:25; 2 Cor. 11:9)
- Paul's joy is not in the gift but the giver
- He is not hinting at wanting more from them (11)
- He is not complaining, or rebuking them
- His joy was not shaped by his circumstances

The Lesson Learned

- 1. I have learned to be content (11)
- 2. I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry (12)
- 3. I know how to get along with little (12)
- 4. I know how to live in prosperity (12)
