

# INSTRUCTIONS

In these final verses of the second chapter Paul gives instructions for both men and women. The section about women brings many questions. It is good to take a careful look at what is said.

#### 1 Timothy 2:8-15

Therefore I want the men in every place to pray, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and dissension.

<sup>9</sup> Likewise, *I want* women to adorn themselves with proper clothing, modestly and discreetly, not with braided hair and gold or pearls or costly garments, 10 but rather by means of good works, as is proper for women making a claim to godliness. <sup>11</sup> A woman must quietly receive instruction with entire submissiveness. 12 But I do not allow a woman to teach or exercise authority over a man, but to remain quiet. <sup>13</sup> For it was Adam who was first created, and then Eve. 14 And it was not Adam who was deceived, but the woman being deceived, fell into transgression. 15 But women will be preserved through the bearing of children if they continue in faith and love and sanctity with self-restraint.

## **Submission Carries a Negative Taste for many:**

What does 'submission' mean?

- (1) Submission is not a woman's thing, but it is a DISCIPLE'S thing

- Without anger or quarrelling (ESV)
- Without anger or argument (CEB)

#### I want women:

TO NOT TEACH \_\_\_\_\_ A MAN (12)

Some would say Paul's instructions to women are cultural. Since times have changed so have these restrictions. Is that true?

### (A) Proper Clothing (9-10)

- 1. OUTSIDE: Braided hair, gold, pearls, costly: showing off
- 2. INSIDE: Modest, discreet, good works, claim to godliness
  - ESV: modesty and self-control - CEB: modest and sensible
- Using good judgment

Paul seems rather

"bossy" (I want...I do

not allow).

Why does Paul get his way?

1 Pet 3:3-5

Your clothing makes a statement: let it say that you are a disciple of Jesus

# (B) Women & Instruction (11-12)

- 1. Quietly receive instruction in submission
- 2. Not to exercise authority over a man

What two reasons are given?

One writer calls this section the most offensive to contemporary sensitivities

- Not to teach over a man qualifies vs.
  - 11 and is negatively illustrated by the actions of
- This statement does not mean a woman cannot teach (Titus 2:3-5; Acts 21:9) and it does not mean she cannot teach a man (Col 3:16; Acts 18:26)
- It means she is not to teach in such a way that disregards her place of subjection

## (C) Positive Ending (15)

- 1. Through a woman sin was introduced into the world. Through a woman came the Messiah (Gal 4:4)
- 2. Women are unique in regards to bearing children. They will be saved as they continue in faith, love and sanctity.
