- *diakonia* (noun): service or _____ (1 Cor 16:15; Luke 10:40)

- In the infant days of the church (Acts 2:42-47; 4:32-35) a conflict began to brew (6:1-7) which, if mishandled, could have led to terrible disruption and division.
