

What is grace? We sometimes sing, "Amazing grace, how sweet the sound!" Several New Testament letters begin with "Grace to you." In 1 Peter 5:10, our Creator is called "the God of all grace." But what *is* grace?

Here's a good place to begin: we're given new answers to **"What is grace?"** every single day. Listen

to the apostle Paul in Acts 17:

"The God who made the world and everything in it, being Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by man, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mankind _____ and _____



and ______ ... 'In him we live and move and have our being' ... 'For we are indeed his offspring.'" (17:24-28)

In Matthew 5:45, Jesus taught us that our Father in heaven "makes his sun rise on the _____ and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the _____."

Do you see that? Every day, God makes *his* sun rise on people who choose to disobey him. Every single day, God shows grace. What is grace? Grace is:

Lamentations 3:22-23 summarizes it well: The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new ______ morning; great is your faithfulness.
