



On Sunday, we learned that the Bible word for being “set free” from slavery is **redemption**. When someone is “saved,” there’s a problem and someone else helps. For the next few Wednesday nights, we want to look at some **Great Stories of Salvation**. Can you find **Exodus** in your Bible? It’s easy to find! It’s the second book. The children of Israel in Exodus are a great example of **redemption**. They needed help. They were slaves and God **redeemed** them.

Listen to what Moses said to them in **Exodus 14:13**:

“Fear not, stand firm, and see the _____ of the LORD,
which he will work for you today.”

Exodus is a **redemption** story. But why did all those people need to be saved? Mr. Jason gave us a good summary of Exodus, the second book in your Bible:

- **Exodus 1**: from the 12 sons of Jacob being welcomed in Egypt to slavery
- **Exodus 2**: _____ is born
- **Exodus 3**: the burning bush
- **Exodus 4**: “Let my people _____”
- **Exodus 6**: “I will redeem you”
- **Exodus 7-12**: _____ terrible plagues



So how did God save his people when the Red Sea was in front of them and hundreds of Egyptian chariots were chasing after them?

Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea... (**Exo 14:21**)

Thus the LORD _____ Israel that day from the hand of the Egyptians... (**Exo 14:30**)

And how did Moses describe what God did?

“You have led in your steadfast love the people whom you have _____...” (**Exo 15:13**)
