"You shall have no other _____ before me. In 1 Corinthians 10, Paul uses various scenes from the past to teach Christians. But in verse 7, he gives a warning for the present:

Do not be ______ as some of them were...

After emphasizing why we have the Old Testament writings (10:11) and encouraging us to be humble in the face of temptation (10:12-13), the warning is repeated in verse 14:

Therefore, my beloved, ______ from idolatry.

So what is idolatry? An idol is...

- Anything more ______ to you than God
- Anything you're _____ on for what only God can give
- Anything so _____ to you that, if you lost it, you're not sure life would still be worth living

Yes, idolatry is still very much a dangerous temptation.
