Elijah challenged all of the people and the 450 prophets of Baal to a contest on Mount Carmel. "How long will you go limping between two different opinions? If the LORD is God, follow him; but if Baal, then follow him." (I Kings 18:21)

What happened when all those prophets of Baal called out to their idol?

...there was no voice. No one answered; no one paid attention. (1 Kings 18:29)

Why? Because idols are nothing. (Psa 115:5-7).

But when Elijah called out to the one true God, fire fell from heaven and the people of Israel finally remembered, "The LORD, he is God" (I Kings 18:39).

We need to always remember, there's only **ONE** God and no thing, no one is more important than him.


