- Let's listen to **John 1:14** and **8:31-32**. Satan is the deceiver; what about our King? How is he different?
- How did the serpent "bruise" the "heel" of Jesus?
- Finally, let's think through another promise in **Romans 16:19-20**. How does it relate to **Genesis 3**?
