



Exodus 34:6 gives us a great description of what our amazing God is like:

The LORD passed before him and proclaimed, “The LORD, the LORD, a God merciful and _____, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness...”

God is **GRACIOUS**. What’s that mean? Sometimes our Bibles describe **grace** as _____...

“Why have I found **favor** in your eyes, that you should take notice of me, since I am a foreigner?”
(Ruth 2:10)

...or _____ ...

Whoever oppresses a poor man insults his Maker, but he who is **generous** to the needy honors him. (Prov 14:31)

When someone is given **grace**, they don’t get what’s **fair**, they are offered **favor**. Instead of getting what they **deserve**, they are given a generous _____ instead (Psa 103:8-11).



When we look in our Bibles at Jesus, we’re looking at **GRACE** in the flesh (2 Cor 8:9). But Jesus has done more than serve as a good example for us. He’s called **US** to follow in his steps:

Let your _____ always be **gracious**, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person. (Col 4:6)

Or, as the apostle Peter put it in 1 Peter 2:19-23:

For this is a **gracious** thing, when, mindful of God, one endures sorrows while suffering unjustly... if when you do good and suffer for it you endure, this is a **gracious** thing in the sight of God. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you might _____ in his steps. He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten...

What is God like? God is **gracious**.
