- Josiah was only <u>years old when he began to</u> reign in Jerusalem. He was one of the few good kings of Judah, doing what was right in the eyes of the LORD (2 Kings 22:1-2).
- When he was 26, he told his servants to use money that had been collected from the people to repair the (2 Kings 22:3-7).



 While making the repairs, Hilkiah the high priest found the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the Law which had been given by God through Moses to the children of Israel (2 Kings 22:8-10); the Book had apparently been lost or hidden, perhaps during the long reign of wicked King Manasseh—Josiah's grandfather—who reigned for 55 years in Jerusalem (2 Kings 21:1-18).

- When Josiah \_\_\_\_\_\_ the words of the Book of the Law read, he was devastated and ashamed that God's people had not been obeying God's will (2 Kings 22:11-13).
- In 2 Kings 23, Josiah zealously worked to \_\_\_\_\_\_ the nation of Judah and initiate a spiritual revival.
