## 04 · God the SPIRIT

God the **Father** fulfilled a wonderful plan to send God the **Son** to save us and God the **Spirit** to guide us. God is **ABOVE** us, **FOR** us, and **WITH** us. Where can we know the Spirit has been specifically at work?



- \_\_\_\_\_: "In the beginning," God the Spirit was there (Gen 1:1-2; Psa 104:30)
- → \_\_\_\_\_: God the Spirit was instrumental in revealing God's will throughout the Old Testament (Zech 7:8, 11-12; 2 Pet 1:21)
- → \_\_\_\_\_: God the Son promised that God the Spirit would play a pivotal role in the Father's plan after Jesus' resurrection and ascension (John 14:25-26; 16:12-13; 1 Cor 2:6-13; Eph 3:3-5)
- → \_\_\_\_\_: God the Spirit provided miraculous gifts to guide disciples in the first century (Acts 2:4; 1 Cor 12:4-11)
- → \_\_\_\_\_: God the Spirit continues to play a pivotal role in the new birth of all Christians (John 3:5; Titus 3:4-7)
- \_\_\_\_\_: disciples of Jesus are blessed to have God the Spirit as a guide, a seal, and a guarantee (Gal 5:16, 18, 25, 22-23; Eph 1:13-14)

Who is God? Father, Son, and Spirit. Equal in essence. Perfect in unity and harmony. Each having their particular role and work.

Nothing matters more than having a relationship with God. Knowing the God



who is **ABOVE** us, **FOR** us, and **WITH** us is more significant than knowing anything else.

## For Class & Family Discussion:
