When the childrer	n of Israel saw Pharaoh'	's army, they were terrified (Exodus 14:11-12). But notice how
Moses encourag	ed them in Exodus 14:13	3-14:
"Fear not, sta	and firm, and	the salvation of the LORD, which he will work for
you today. Fo	r the Egyptians whom y	you see today, you shall never see again. The
	will fight for yo	ou, and you have only to be silent."

When Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, the LORD drove the sea back with a strong east wind and the waters were divided. "And the people of Israel went

the midst of the sea on dry ground" (Exodus 14:21-22). When the Egyptians tried to follow, the waters came back on them and they drowned. "Thus the LORD saved Israel that day" (Exodus 14:30).



But what does this have to do with our search for our King? Can you find I Corinthians 10:1-2 in your Bible? Let's read that together...

Just as Israel followed Moses through the Red Sea by faith (Hebrews II:29), Jesus is "the _____" (John I4:6). Jesus is the Savior who calls us to be baptized in water (Romans 6:3-4). Jude even describes Jesus as the one "who saved a people out of the land of Egypt" (Jude 5).

Crossing the Red Sea was like a baptism for Israel, and baptism continues to be a kind of crossing from the slavery of sin to new life for all who will follow Jesus as their Savior and Leader.
