(1 Corinthians 10:1-4)


What was this "spiritual drink" and what does Paul mean by referring to the Rock as Jesus Christ? In order to understand, we need to open our Bibles back to Exodus 17 when the children Israel were camped at Rephidim and there was no water.

Therefore the people quarreled with Moses and said, 'Give us water to drink.' And Moses said to them, 'Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you <u>test</u> the LORD?' But the people thirsted there for water, and the people grumbled against Moses... (Exodus 17:2-3)

How did God respond? He told Moses...

"Behold, I will stand before you there on the rock at Horeb, and you shall **strike** the rock, and water shall come out of it, and the people will drink." (Exodus 17:6)

Moses did, and water flowed out of a rock to keep the children of Israel alive. But what does this have to do with our search for our King?



In John 4, Jesus crossed paths with a woman from Samaria at a well. Listen to what he said: "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to <u>eternal</u> life." (John 4:13-14)

Again, in John 7:38, Jesus cried out and said:


"Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of <u>living</u> water."


TIMELINE Building Blocks:




Flood

Did you hear what the children of Israel asked in Exodus 17:7? They said, "Is the LORD among us or not?" What do you think they meant by that? How might we struggle with that same question today?

Exodus 17 taught us that Moses "struck" the rock and water came out. The apostle Paul described Jesus Christ as "the Rock" in I Corinthians IO. In what way was Jesus "struck"? Isaiah 53:4, Matthew 26:31, and John 19:34 all might be helpful passages to read in your Bible. How was Jesus "struck," and what sort of blessings have flowed to all as a result?
