

"And let them make me a sanctuary, that I may <u>dwell</u> in their midst. Exactly as I show you concerning the pattern of the tabernacle, and of all its furniture, so you shall make it." (Exodus 25:8-9)

Throughout Exodus 25-30, the LORD reveals that pattern for the tabernacle—his dwelling place among the children of Israel:

- \subseteq The curtains that formed the outer court (Exo 27:9-19)
- Interpretation State (€xo 27:1-8)
- ☑ The tabernacle (Exo 26)
- \bigcirc The table for bread (Exo 25:23-30)
- Stepsing Stepsing (Exo 25:31-40)
- Interaltar of incense (Exo 30:1-10)
- \bigcirc The ark of the covenant (Exo 25:10-22)


But what does this have to do with our search for our King? In John I, notice how Jesus, "the Word" who was with God and was God, is described:

And the Word became flesh and dwelt (literally, "<u>tabernacled</u>") among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. (John 1:14)

The writer of Hebrews goes on to describe Jesus' deep connection to that Old Testament tabernacle:

- He entered "once for all" into the "greater and more perfect tent," into "heaven itself," thus "securing an eternal redemption" (9:11-12, 24)
- Therefore, we can have "confidence to <u>enter</u> the holy places by the blood of Jesus" (10:19-22)

The tabernacle was amazing, but what Jesus has done for us is even MORE amazing!
