

Can you find Luke 6 again in your Bible? Listen to what we find in Luke 6:13-16:

And when day came, he called his disciples and chose from them twelve, whom he named apostles: Simon, whom he named Peter, and Andrew his brother, and James and John, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James the son of Alphaeus, and Simon who was called the Zealot, and Judas the son of James, and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor.

Who WERE these apostles? Let's look into the background of just a few of them to see what we can learn...

- Peter, Andrew, James, and John were <u>fishermen</u> from Galilee (Matthew 4:18-22).
- Matthew [also known as Levi] was a <u>tax</u> collector who was working for the Roman Empire (Matthew 9:9-13).
- Simon was called "the <u>Zealot</u>." Zealots hated the Roman Empire and people who worked for the Empire (like tax collectors).



These men would **NOT** have been best friends! They didn't have much in common. They came from different places, with different backgrounds; they had different friends and different ways of looking at the world. But what did they have in common? <u>Jesus</u>. Jesus called them to follow him. Jesus started teaching and changing their lives. They were **VERY** different, but they grew to be united around Jesus as the Son of God.

What Jesus did in the lives of these men was just the beginning of what he would eventually do in the life of his church (Ephesians 2:15-22). The church is made up of VERY different people with different backgrounds from different parts of the world, but we can all be united around Jesus.

Let's thank God for what he showed us in the lives of the apostles!
