

"The prophets" are an indispensable part of the church's foundation. Men like Elijah, Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Daniel "spoke from God as they were _____along by the Holy Spirit" (2 Pet 1:21). But they weren't the only ones. "The apostles" were "eyewitnesses" of Jesus' majesty (2 Pet 1:16) and guided "into all the _____" by the same Holy Spirit (John 16:12-13).
