I have applied all these things to myself and Apollos for your benefit, brothers, that \_\_\_\_\_\_ may learn by us not to go \_\_\_\_\_ what is written, that none of you may be puffed up in favor of one against another.

The apostles lived a VERY long time ago, but there are still REALLY important lessons for US to learn from them. We would still "do well to pay attention" to the words of the apostles and prophets (2 Peter I:16-19). We would still "do well" to be "devoted" to the "apostles' teaching," just like the very first Christians (Acts 2:42). Why? Because whenever and wherever we live, when we read the Godbreathed words delivered to us through those apostles, we can "perceive" their "insight into the mystery of Christ" (Ephesians 3:1-5).

We can understand God's will for our lives because of the work and sacrifices of the apostles!
