

King Saul may have been Israel's first king, but he didn't live like an "anointed one" of God. So, the LORD told Samuel:
"Fill your horn with oil, and go. I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for myself a among his sons." (I Samuel 16:1)
When Samuel arrived, Jesse's seven oldest sons passed before him, but neither one was THE one.
Then Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all your sons here?" And he said, "There remains yet the youngest, but behold, he is keeping the" (I Samuel 16:11)
The name of Jesse's youngest son was <b>David</b> and David was a <b>shepherd</b> .
What sort of things would a shepherd DO? Listen to what David said when
he was about to fight the Philistine giant Goliath:
David said to Saul, "Your servant used to keep sheep for his father. And when there came a lion, or a bear, and took a lamb from the flock, I went after him and struck him and
David was exactly the sort of person God could use to write something as beautiful as Psalm 23:  The is my shepherd; I shall not want.  He makes lie down in green pastures.  He leads me beside still waters. (Psalm 23:1-2)
But what does this have to do with our search for our King? Of all the places for our King to be

B born? "The city of David, which is called \_\_\_\_\_ \_" (Luke 2:4). Who first heard about Jesus' birth? "In the same region there were \_\_\_\_\_ out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night" (Luke 2:8). Jesus is the greatest shepherd of all!
