1.	This is what makes so foolish. What sense does it make for human beings to create "carved images" (Exo 20:4; Acts 17:24-29) when God has already provided images throughout the world—human beings!
2.	Every single person you come in contact with is In Psalm 8, David describes man as "crowned with glory and honor" (8:3-5). We were created to treat each other accordingly. But what fractures God's good will for his image-bearers?

For Class & Family Discussion:

- * "What does it mean to be a human being?" If you were to ask a variety of your peers, what sort of answers might you hear?
- If we leave our Creator completely out of our answers to "What does it mean to be a human being?" what happens? Do we get better answers? How does it impact the way we look at our own selves? How does it impact the way we look at the people around us?
- But what does Psalm 14:1 and Romans 1:19-23 tell us about ourselves if we come up with our own answers and leave God out of the equation? What does it look like today, among your own peers, when people leave God out of the biggest questions of life?
- God has created his image-bearers with incredible diversity, but we haven't always appreciated that diversity as a sign of his eternal power and divine nature. What does it mean to treat every single person I come in contact with as special? What does it look like to treat others as if they are truly "crowned with glory and honor" (Psa 8)?
- Let's explore what it really means to be "conformed to the image of Jesus" (Rom 8:29). Let's open our Bibles together and think through the message of passages like 2 Corinthians 3:18, Romans 12:1-2, Colossians 3:1-10, and 1 Corinthians 15:49. What are we being told? What does it all mean?
- What about you? If you were going to explain "You have been created in God's image" to someone in your own words, how would you do it? What would you say?
