
2 • Blessed By God With a Body

Your body isn't an accident. Your body means something to your Creator. He formed it. He knows what is going on around and inside it. He's blessed you with a body because he cares about you.

Now, it's important to realize: you are MORE than a body and there are more important things about you than your "outward appearance" (I Samuel 16:7). But your body is a gift from God, and the best way to say "Thank you" to God for that gift is to "present" your body "as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God" (Rom 12:1).
