


Now these Jews were more \_\_\_\_\_ than those in Thessalonica... (Acts 17:11)

- Don't "close the book" on teaching and preaching, \_\_\_\_\_ it in the church building or classroom (Psa 119:9-12, 15-16, 27, 148; Luke 2:19).
- Allow the Scriptures to shape you \_\_\_\_\_, as a way of life (Matt 4:4; Mark 4:20).
- Approach opportunities to learn from the Scriptures with \_\_\_\_\_ (Acts 17:11).
- \_\_\_\_\_ yourself to examine the Scriptures (Luke 8:16-18; Eph 6:16-20).
- Be \_\_\_\_\_ that you can discover, study, and understand God-revealed truth (1 Cor 1:12; 2:3-5; 3:5-7; Eph 3:4-5).
- Recognize that some who claim to be speaking words of truth are \_\_\_\_\_ (1 Tim 4:1; 1 John 4:1; 1 Tim 4:6-7).
- \_\_\_\_\_ teaching that surprises, disrupts, or challenges your understanding against the Scriptures before you simply \_\_\_\_\_ it (Acts 18:24-28).
- Be \_\_\_\_\_ enough to take God at his word (James 1:21).
- Give the Scriptures the final \_\_\_\_\_ as the revealed will of the ultimate \_\_\_\_\_ (Heb 4:12-13; Acts 17:13; 2:37).
