A. Acts was written by Luke and is considered Volume two of his writings

> - The Gospel of Luke & Acts comprise 30% of the N.T.

- Luke often puts himself in historical account

- Luke includes numerous names and places that could be verified

- B. There are two running outlines in Acts:
- It follows the spread of the Gospel from Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria into all the world (1:8)
- It follows Peter (ch 1-12)
- It follows Paul (13-28)
- 1. One of the key words in Acts is: witness (used 29x)
 - The Greek word, martus where we get our word "martyr"
- 2. Acts is written with an apologetic tone
