4 • Christ: Wisdom in the Flesh

"What is WISDOM?" Wisdom is "knowing which way to go." God has not only provided a TREASURE



CHEST full of written wisdom in the Bible, but wisdom walked among us in the flesh.

Sometimes, "the wisdom of the world" views the message of the gospel as "folly" or "foolishness."

A God who would die doesn't make much sense to many people. Listen to I Corinthians I:

For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach ______ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the ______ of God. (I:22-24)

Notice especially how 1 Corinthians 1:30 makes a very important point:

And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to _____ wisdom from God...

Wisdom walked among us in the flesh. What is wisdom? Knowing which way to go, which is exactly why Jesus said things like:

"If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and ______ me." (Luke 9:23)



In fact, Jesus would even go so far as to say:

"I am the _____" (John 14:6)

So what does all of this mean for us? Let's listen carefully to the call of Colossians 3:

Let the word of Christ dwell in ______ richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. (3:16-17)

Our Creator has provided everything we need to "reach all the riches of full assurance of understanding and the knowledge of God's mystery, which is Christ, in whom are

all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge" (Colossians 2:2-3).

FOUNDATION STONES

Let's open our Bibles back to Matthew 7. Jesus is God's wisdom in the flesh. No one has ever been more wise than Jesus! Can you
