Powerful Prayers to a Powerful God

As this chapter begins, we find a major shift taking place in persecution of the church. Now Herod gets involved. This brings in a political element and resources that the Jews did not have. Herod has the apostle James

What Happened to the Apostles:

1. **Judas:** committed suicide (Mt 27:5)
2. **James:** killed by Herod (Acts 12:2)

As to the rest of the apostles, there are reliable legends as to what happened to them:

Andrew: preached in present day Turkey and Soviet Union. Was crucified in Greece.

Thomas: traveled as far as India. Was pierced by the swords of four soldiers in India.

Philip: Traveled to North Africa. In Asia Minor it is said that he converted the wife of a Roman official. In retaliation he had the apostle executed around AD 54

Matthew: Preached in Persia and Ethiopia. It is reported that he was stabbed to death about the year AD 60.

Bartholomew: Preached in Ethiopia and Arabia. He died as a martyr.

James: Preached in Syria and was stoned to death.

Simon: Killed in Syria when he refused to sacrifice to a sun god.

Thaddeus: Crucified in Edessa around 72.

Matthias: Was burned to death in Syria.

Paul: Traveled to Rome and was beheaded by Caesar.

Peter: Was crucified upside down in Rome.

John: died of natural causes
