Seven nations were conquered. At last thirty-one kings defeated. Approximately ten thousand square miles of choice property claimed. They were outnumbered but not outpowered. Underequipped but not overwhelmed. They were the unlikely but unquestionable conquerors of some of the most barbaric armies in history...On the time line of

your Bible, the era glistens between the difficult days of Exodus and the dark age of the Judges (*Glory Days*, pg 3, 4).

During the time of Joshua, the Jordan River opened up. The Jericho wall fell down. The Sun stood still and the evil kings of Canaan were booted out. By the end of the campaign, the homeless wanderers became the hope-filled residents of a land promised by God.

- 1. The book of Joshua begins a new section in our Bibles: History (Joshua-Nehemiah) This covers about 1,000 years (1450 B.C.—400 B.C.)
