Joshua 2: Rahab


The second chapter of Joshua begins with Joshua sending two spies to view Jericho. It is here that they meet Rahab.

God devotes the entire chapter to Rahab

- More is said about Rahab than the spies or the city
- She was a Gentile, a citizen of Jericho and a prostitute (5x the expression, "the harlot" follows her name)

A. The Story (1-8)

- 1. The two spies make their way to Jericho. It is a walled city of about 8 acres, just north of the Dead Sea. Jericho is an independent city with it's own king.
- 2. Rahab had a house on the wall of the city.
- 3. The king is aware that the spies are in the city and seeks them out (2-3)
- 4. The reputation of God and Israel preceded the spies.
 - They had heard of the parting of the Red Sea (10) which was 40 years before this
 - They heard about the Amorites being "utterly destroyed" (10)

B. The Promise (15-24)

The covenant between Rahab and the spies was based upon two things

- she was not to tell about the spies (20)
- she was to hang a scarlet rope out her window (18-19)
