



# A New Leader

## A. The book of Joshua begins with the with Five Major Announcements (1:1-9)

- (1) Moses was \_\_\_\_\_ (2)
  - Israel had mourned Moses for 30 days (Deut 34:8)
  - Moses was not to be forgotten. His name is found 57x

- (2) Joshua was going to \_\_\_\_\_ the people into the promise land
  - this had already been determined (Deut 31:3; 34:9)

- (3) God promises that Israel will \_\_\_\_\_ the land (3)
  - 60x the word "inheritance" is found in Joshua
  - land full of other nations (3:10)

- (4) God \_\_\_\_\_ to be with Joshua (5)

- (5) God's plea to \_\_\_\_\_ with His \_\_\_\_\_ (8)

*God didn't command Joshua to seek a spiritual experience, pursue a personal revelation or long for goose bumps-giving emotion. God's word to him is his word to us: open the Bible.*

### The Wilderness Trail of Tears (Num 14:28-32)

- 1. Num 1:46 says that there were 603,550 men that came out of Egypt (Ex 12:37-38)
- Assuming each was married: 1,207,100 adults that left Egypt
- If they all died in the 40 years of the wilderness (30,000 deaths a year/83 deaths a day)
