

•	Is there anything we can learn about Jacob from his reaction the next morning to what he has experienced (28:18-22)?
•	What can we learn about Leah from the names she gives to her children in 29:31-35?
•	What can we learn about Rachel from her attitude and actions in 30:1-8?
•	Why does tension seem to develop between Laban and Jacob in 30:25-43? How do both men handle the tension?
•	What small insight might we have about Jacob and the way he perceives his relationship with God in 31:5?
•	Notice again how Jacob describes God in 31:42. How would you describe his present frame of mind and faith? Genesis 31:53 might also be helpful here
