In a study of Maturity, no one wants to be identified as being immature. And, while many may talk a good game, maturity is best illustrated in a moment of crisis. In this lesson, we will look at a Biblical example.



David was the new national hero. Saul was the king.

<u>1 Samuel 18:5-9</u>

So David went out wherever Saul sent him, and prospered; and Saul set him over the men of war. And it was pleasing in the sight of all the people and also in the sight of Saul's servants. ⁶ It happened as they were coming, when David returned from killing the Philistine, that the women came out of all the cities of Israel. singing and dancing, to meet King Saul, with tambourines, with joy and with musical instruments. ⁷ The women sang as they played, and said,

"Saul has slain his thousands, And David his ten thousands."

⁸ Then Saul became very angry, foWhen r this saying displeased him; and he said, "They have ascribed to David ten thousands, but to me they have ascribed thousands. Now what more can he have but the kingdom?" ⁹ Saul looked at David with suspicion from that day on."
