1 Corinthians 15

This is the Resurrection chapter of the Bible. Sandwiched between guestions about spiritual gifts (12-14) and guestions about the collection (16), we find Paul's powerful proclamation of the Resurrection.

The Corinthians may have had questions about the resurrection and Paul simply jumped in without the common, "Now concerning" beginning.

Paul's words answer the problem: "How do some among you say that there is no resurrection of the dead?" (12) and "How are the dead raised and what kind of body do they come?" (35)


