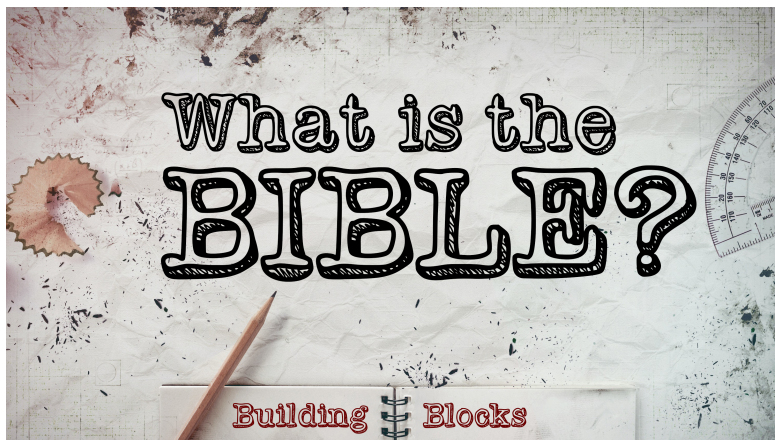


## 2 • All Scripture is Breathed Out By God

## For Class & Family Discussion:

- Your Bible is full of “sacred” writings. Our video used the example of shoes. Can you think of another example? How about the difference between a T-shirt and a wedding dress? What makes something “sacred”?
  
- What makes the writings in your Bible “sacred”? They are “breathed out” by God. Why is that a really big deal?
  
- Let’s take a look back at what Paul wrote in **2 Timothy 3:15-17**. What did he mean by...
  - “The sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation”? What does it mean to be “wise”? And what is *this* sort of wisdom?
  
  - “Through faith in Christ Jesus”? Do you remember what we learned in our last study? According to **Romans 10:17**, how do we get faith? And who does faith need to be in?
  
  - “All Scripture”? What is “Scripture”? What would Paul have had in mind?
  
  - “Profitable”? What does that word mean? When something is “profitable,” it’s...
    - “For teaching”: what are some examples of what the Bible teaches us?
  
    - “For reproof”: how does the Bible step on our toes?
  
    - “For correction”: what are some examples of the way the Bible corrects us?
  
    - “For training”: how does the Bible “train” us? And for what?
  
- How does someone become “acquainted with” these sacred writings like Timothy had?
