

## **Gained Approval**

Hebrews 11:39-40 "And all these, having gained approval through their faith, did not receive what was promised, because God had provided something better for us, so that apart from us they would not be made perfect."

We have come to our final class in this series. We have taken a close look at ten of the fifteen specific names listen in Hebrews 11, the chapter of faith, conviction and courage. These were all heroes. They all had to make difficult choices. They faced incredible opposition. By faith, they stand approved of God. They are listed here as a reminder to the Hebrew Christians to keep on and to "Finish what was started." They are not the only ones to walk the difficult road of faith. "Surrounding us" (12:1) are these great examples and reminders.

  - run fixing our eyes on the enduring Jesus (12:2)
