

The glory of the Lord is a focal point for our first quarter of 2024 as we learn more and more about **Bringing the Best**. When you think of the **"glory"** (Hebrew: *kavod*, "\_\_\_\_\_") of God, what comes to mind?

- Most of us probably think of his \_\_\_\_\_\_ (Psa 19:1; Isa 40:12; Psa 65:5-8; 78:4; Exo 3:19; 32:11).
- But at a difficult and challenging time in Israel's early history (Exo 32-33), Moses said to the LORD, "Please show me your glory" (33:18), and the LORD drew attention to his \_\_\_\_\_\_ (34:1-7), revealing himself as a God:
  - compassionate, tenderhearted (Psa 103:13)
  - \_\_\_\_\_: favor, generosity (Psa 103:7-8, 10)
  - to anger: patient kindness (Psa 103:9, 14)
  - Abounding in steadfast \_\_\_\_\_: selfless loyalty (Psa 103:11)
  - Abounding in \_\_\_\_\_: stability, reliability (Psa 103:15-19)
  - iniquity and transgression and sin (Psa 103:12)
- "But," he said, "you cannot see my \_\_\_\_\_, for man shall not see me and live" (Exo 33:20). And that was true (1 Tim 6:16), until...
  - \* "And the Word became \_\_\_\_\_\_ and dwelt among us..." (John 1:14-18)
  - "Whoever has seen me has seen the \_\_\_\_\_" (John 14:8-9; Heb 1:3)

## The real point of beholding the glory of the LORD? \_\_\_\_\_\_.

- Honoring his glory would make Israel "\_\_\_\_\_" (Exo 33:16)
- "Beholding" and "being transformed" (2 Cor 3:7-8, 3:12-4:6, 15; 3:3)
