Lesson Four: Attitudes Toward Scriptures (2)

Last week we introduced this lesson about "Attitudes Toward Scriptures." We looked at some very common attitudes about the Bible. It is not enough that one uses the Bible, if they do not use it correctly.

- In Genesis 3:4 the devil created distrust in God by simply adding one word
- In Matthew 4:5-7, the devil quoted a passage to the Lord, but misused it

A. Another common attitude today, "My security is not in what I believe, but in Who I believe in."

- The impression is that if we care about beliefs, practices and doctrines then we are putting our security in ourselves rather than in Jesus.
- Is it possible to disconnect <u>What</u> I believe from the <u>ONE WHOM</u> I believe in?
 - Or, Is it possible to believe in Jesus while practicing anti-Jesus things or holding anti-Jesus views?

Jas 2:19 "You believe that God is one. You do well; the demons also believe, and shudder."

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Out of the Reformation Movement came, *Scriptura Sola*, a Latin expression that meant, Scripture Alone.

Out of the American Restoration Movement came the expression, "We speak where the Bible speaks and are silent where it is silent."

B. How is Biblical Authority established?

God uses the basic component of communication:

- Approach Bereans took (Acts 17:11)
- Approach in Acts 15 (Peter: implying—7-11; Paul: showing—12; James: telling—13-21)
