Within the Sermon on the Mount, our Lord addressed an aspect of human nature that is illustrated every day—liking those who like you. Jesus said, "If you love those who love you..." (Mt 5:46) and "If you greet only your brothers..." (Mt 5:47). It is within this context that

Jesus shows that God sends blessings upon the good and the bad (Mt 5:45). The Lord wants us to "love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (Mt 5:44).

The fact that there are enemies and those that want to hurt you, it is important to understand the attitude and actions that God wants His people to take.


