


Vision/Planning

Seasons—they define our weather and our journey in life. The word "season" first appears in the Bible on the creation page:

Genesis 1:14 "Then God said, 'Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night, and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years."

Psalm 104:19 "He made the moon for the seasons; the sun knows the place of its setting.

We recognize the different seasons in weather patterns.

There is Winter, Spring, Summer and Fall. These same four patterns can be found in LIFE: Senior Citizen (Winter); Adult (Fall); Young Person (Summer); Child (Spring). These same descriptions can be seen in



the seasons of faith: new babe in Christ to Mature in Christ.
