


2 Peter 1:6 "and in your knowledge, <u>self-control</u>, and in your self-control, perseverance, and in your perseverance, godliness."



Definition: The word self-control comes from the Greek word "Enkrateria". The root word, "krateria" means strength. The meaning is power of oneself or self –mastery. It is not the elimination of ambition, passion, desire or even anger. It is the inner strength that controls these emotions. It is the power to say "No," to self. Before we can conquer the world, we must

be able to conquer ourselves. Self-control is the choice to be governed by principles, wisdom and judgment rather than impulses, emotions and thoughtless whims.

1. What we say

James 1:26 If anyone thinks himself to be religious, and yet does not bridle his tongue, but deceives his own heart, this man's religion is worthless.

Proverbs 13:3 The one who guards his mouth preserves his life; the one who opens wide his lips comes to ruin.

2. Our anger

Proverbs 15:18 A hot-tempered man stirs up strife, but the slow to anger calms a dispute

Proverbs 25:28 Like a city that is broken into and without walls, is a man who has no control over his spirit.

Proverbs 16:32 He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit, than he who captures a city.

Proverbs 17:27 He who restrains his words has knowledge, and he who has a cool spirit is a man of understanding.

Ephesians 4:26-27 Be angry, and yet do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and do not give the devil an opportunity.

3. Our Passions

Romans 6:12-13 "Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its lusts, and do not go on presenting the members of your body to sin as instruments of unrighteousness; but present yourselves to God as those alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God.
