01 · Love Honors God

Love is ____... It's hard to imagine the number of answers that have been offered to fill in that blank. This month, let's look beyond ourselves, past the mirages of popular culture, and consult the Creator.

First up, **love honors God**. In Matthew 22, a Pharisee asked Jesus, "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus' response?

"You shall <u>love</u> the Lord your God with all your <u>heart</u> and with all your <u>soul</u> and with all your <u>mind</u>. This is the great and <u>first</u>

commandment." (22:37-38)

Okay, but what does that **mean**? 1 John 4 provides a great starting point:

- <u>God</u> is love (4:8)
- Love is **from** God (4:7)
- God's love is shown most clearly in the sending of his <u>Son</u> so that we might <u>live</u> (4:9-10)

Alright, but what will it **look like** for *us* to love?

Therefore be <u>imitators</u> of God, as beloved children.

And <u>walk</u> in love, as Christ loved us and <u>gave</u>

<u>himself up</u> for us, a fragrant offering and <u>sacrifice</u>
to God. (Eph 5:1-2)

Sadly, a lot of people have the mistaken idea that love means letting me do whatever I want to do. That's exactly backwards. Love is giving myself up, first to God. Love is a choice to put others—God above all—ahead of myself. I honor God by presenting myself as a "living sacrifice" (Rom 11:36-12:1). Then, "it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me" (Gal 2:20). Love is the commitment of an imperfect person to honor a perfect God.
