Thousands of years after it was written, Psalm 96 continues to call. It's a call issued to all of creation, stretching across centuries, echoing throughout the earth. Even today, it lifts our eyes and focuses our attention on the God who has blessed us with another day. The Lord's day. Psalm 96 is a call to act.

Sing to the LORD. Bless his name. Tell of his salvation from day to day. Declare his glory among the nations. Share his marvelous works among all the peoples. Forsake all worthless idols and fearfully praise the maker of the heavens. Behold his splendor, majesty, and beauty. Ascribe to the LORD glory and strength. Bring an offering. "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am and in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Matt 11:28-29)

We have just a few "I am" statements of Jesus in the gospels (John 6:35; 8:12, 58; 10:7, 11; 11:25; 14:6; 15:1), and nearly all of them are comparisons. When Jesus actually described his heart? He did so in terms of gentle lowliness. But those weren't just words.

the disciple to be _____ his teacher, and the servant like his master." (10:24-25)










Maps showing the location of all our children's classes are available at
