Why does the way we handle it matter? There's much to learn, so let's open our ears and hearts to see what *Proverbs* has to teach us about wealth.

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	A rich man's wealth is his strong city, and like a high wall in his (18:11) In what way can wealth be like a "strong city" and a "high wall" for the rich person? But why do you think Solomon adds, "in his imagination"?
	The rich rules over the poor, and the borrower is the of the lender. (22:7)  Is that true? If so, how is the borrower "the slave" to the lender? Is there any wise principle there that we need to understand and apply, even in the 21st century?
	Treasures gained by do not profit, but righteousness delivers from death. (10:2) Riches do not profit in the day of wrath, but righteousness from death. (11:4)
	Whoever in his riches will fall, but the righteous will flourish like a green leaf. (11:28)
	What does it look like for someone to "trust in" their riches? Why do you think we are so strongly warned against that?

	One freely, yet grows all the richer;
	another withholds what he should give, and only suffers want. (11:24)
	Whoever is to the poor lends to the LORD,
	and he will repay him for his deed. (19:17)
	Why do you think God cares so much about his people being generous?
	Whoever oppresses a poor man his Maker, but he who is generous to the needy honors him. (14:31)
Pro	overbs also has a great deal to say about work ethic (6:6-11).
	A hand causes poverty,
	but the hand of the diligent makes rich. (10:4)
	In all toil there is profit,
	but mere tends only to poverty. (14:23)
	Why do you think <i>Proverbs</i> encourages us to think so carefully about the way we hold on (or at least <i>try</i> to hold on) to our wealth (13:11; 23:4-5; 15:27)?
Fir	nally, what difference should this nugget of wisdom make in our everyday lives?  The rich and the poor meet;  the Lord is the Maker of them all. (22:2)
