

We've encountered a lot of subjects and traveled down several side paths along the long "walk" of wisdom described throughout *Proverbs*. **But what is the real goal?** You might remember Jesus' words in Matthew 16:26: "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what shall a man give in return for his soul?" To make a similar point relating to *Proverbs*, what good will all of the knowledge and wisdom in the world really do for me if I don't have a relationship with the LORD behind the wisdom?

In Proverbs 8, we hear wisdom speaking. Notice what she reveals:

"The LORD possessed me at the ______ of his work, the first of his acts of old.

Ages ago I was _____ up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth." (8:22-23)

"For whoever finds me finds _____ and obtains favor from the LORD..." (8:35)

Let's think about what wisdom is telling us for a moment. In what way does wisdom serve as a kind of bridge between us and the God who created all things?

Listen to the way the LORD is described throughout *Proverbs*. If we open our ears and our hearts, our perspective will be impacted and potential blessings will be revealed.
