Psalm 121 is one of the Songs of Ascents (Psa 120-134), believed to be used as God's people in ages past made their way "up" to Jerusalem (122:3-4). Take a moment to reflect on its beginning...

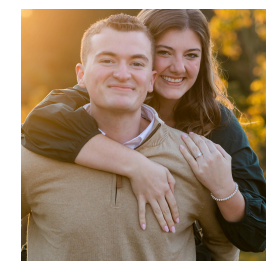
