Questions
God Asks

To read before class: [Genesis 3](#)

To begin, an important question: why would an all-knowing God ([Psa 139:1-6](#); [1 Sam 16:7](#); [Prov 15:3](#); [Heb 4:12-13](#)) even ask questions of human beings?

What is going on in [Genesis 3](#)? How does it fit into the big picture of the Bible?

Interestingly, the serpent asks a question of his own in [3:1](#). What do you think? Are there differences between the questions of the tempter and the questions God asks? If so, in what ways?

When the LORD God called to the man, he asked him three questions and one question of the woman ([3:8-13](#)): “Where are you?” “Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten of the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?” “What is this that you have done?”

- ❖ Most close to home, what can we learn from these questions God asked?
